





## Café Philosophy Afternoon

# Global Citizenship Student Conference

August 1 - Cosmopolitanism: A Philosophy for Global Citizenship. The New Zealand Centre for Global Studies presents a day-long, inter-school conference. The conference will be largely organised by the New Zealand Centre for Global Studies.

The student conferences aim to encourage NZ high-school students to think creatively



and realistically about the concept of global citizenship in an encouraging and stimulating setting. The discussion will explore the meaning of global citizenship in terms of global processes, interconnectivity, and intercultural dialogue.

Students will also examine how globalisation can affect their individual lives and the political process.

This examination will be anchored in a cosmopolitan context – if we are 'citizens of the world' then what implication does this have for both individual conduct and for national policy towards the challenges of the 21st century.

We farewell our dear friend and colleague, Dr. Jonathan McKeown-Green, who peacefully Passed away on 11 February 2015. Jon led a full life as a musician, teacher, philosopher and Christian. He also contributed much

time and energy to the promotion of philosophy in schools. An inspirational man, Jon embodied the spirit of philosophy education:

For teaching is the communication of insight. It throws out the clues, the pointed hints that lead to insight. It cajoles attention to drive away distracting images that stand in insights way. It puts the further questions that reveal the need to further insights to modify and complement the acquired store. It has grasped the strategy of developing intelligence, and so begins from the simple to advance to the more complex. (Bernard Lonergran (1957) Insight, p. 198)
